2nd May all barriers be removed from people attending church today. May Katherine be inspired by the Holy Spirit in her preparations and leading of our service and may all present feel the peace of God.

Today is the International Day of Prayer for Persecuted Christians. We pray for an end to the persecution of Christians throughout the world.

3rd Pray for our Lord to guide Katherine in all she does this month and to give her times of rest and relaxation amid all the busyness.

Pray for those suffering the grief of bereavement. May they know the comfort of God's love, the kindness and company of friends and hope in God's promise of everlasting life.

4th May God bless our Open House every Tuesday. Ask for God to strengthen all those who make it possible and may many more in Tranent find out about, attend and enjoy this time of friendship and fellowship.

The Kirk Session meets tonight. God says that His people shall dream dreams and see visions. Our church starts work this month on our vision for the future. Pray that our conversations will be inspired by the Holy Spirit and lead to good choices, pleasing to God.

5th Pray for blessing on all attending the Pool group today.

Please pray for the Christian Institute, which stands up for the rights of Christians in the UK and abroad. Pray that the message of the Lord will spread rapidly and be honoured (2 Thessalonians 3 v1), for more opportunities to reach politicians and the media with our concerns, for safety as they travel around the country meeting supporters and for wisdom and endurance as they seek to address the many issues we face. May the Lord be pleased to bless the staff and Trustees of the Institute.

- **6**th Father, You are more powerful than we can ever imagine. Jesus overcame all evil and His sacrifice is extended to all who believe in Him. We pray for the faith and expectancy to see You work through us, Your people, in our everyday lives. Thank You for Your strength. Amen.
- **7**th Pray for all involved in Christians in Sport as they seek to reach out with the Gospel through sport and also to support Christian sportsmen and sportswomen of all ages in the unique challenges they face. CIS asks for Churches everywhere to pray for their local sport communities so let us all do just that. Also ask for guidance from God on how our church can interact with sports clubs in our area.
- 8th May the presence of the Holy Spirit be felt by all attending the Prayer Meeting this morning and may our Lord answer their prayers according to His will. Please pray for encouragement and perseverance for the work of our church in local schools. May young minds and hearts be open to the stories of our God's love and care and may many find a spiritual home in our church. May God empower Debbie in all she does as our Youth and Family Worker including in the Elphinstone Drop Ins on Monday and Wednesday afternoon's in the Community Centre.
- 9th Today we hold Remembrance Services to honour those who have given their lives for others and to remember the suffering and grief that war brings. Pray that

the services at the Tranent and Elphinstone War Memorials and in our church will witness to God's love for the world and to God's power to bring peace.

10th COP 30 meets in Belem, Brazil from 10th to 21st November. You might like to hold a time of silent prayer - a silent vigil - for (say) 5 minutes each day as you hold this important gathering before God. You might like to light a candle as a focus with the simple prayer that God's light and love would shine over COP 30.

11th Today is Remembrance Day and we give thanks for those who gave their tomorrows for our todays. We pray for peace in our world, especially in Ukraine and Israel, Gaza and the surrounding region.

Pray for uplifting conversations at Open House this morning.

The Guild is an integral part of our church and we pray for good fellowship at all their meetings, including today when the speaker is from The Scottish Fire and Rescue Service. We ask our Lord to call others to join our Guild.

12th Pray for the Exploring Discipleship Course which meets tonight in our Church Hall. May many attend to consider what it means to follow Jesus.

Pray that all our Christmas outreach events will go well and that many people who are not yet Christians will attend and consider what they have heard and that in time they will come to faith in Christ.

Pray that, even as they endure suffering, they will consider the enemy's threats and respond with renewed confidence in the Lord's sovereign plans for His people (2 Kings 19 v17-19). Pray that the growing power of jihadists across the continent will be broken and that there will be peace for all Africans.

15th May all those who are able to come along and enjoy fellowship at our weekly Prayer Meeting as we lift to our amazing Lord our concerns, requests and gratitude.

Thank God for our Hall and for those who look after it as we hold our ceilidh this evening. Thank God for the work of Mike Watson and the Explorer Scouts who are sharing this evening with us. Pray that our links may be strengthened and grow.

16th May we all enjoy attending church and grow in our faith as we pray, sing and listen to Bible readings and the sermon from Katherine. The time of fellowship is also valuable and we give thanks for all who assist with the teas and coffees after the service.

"There is a fire in me, Burns all day and night, Flares at injustice, Leaps at oppression, Glows warmly in beauty."

22nd We give thanks for the privilege of being able to pray and may the prayers at this morning's Prayer Meeting be pleasing to God.

Pray for those behind the scenes, those who carry out services to make our life at Tranent Parish Church smoother, enabling us to pull together. To name some is to miss out many but please pray for those who serve on the rotas including serving tea/coffee and collecting and banking the offerings.
