From our Minister

Dear Friends

You may have heard it said that "change is the only constant in life". These words have been around for a long time, being those of an ancient Greek philosopher who lived in Turkey around 500 BC. There is something in them for our times too. I write



to you during Creation Time, the time from 1 September to 4th October, the date of the feast of St Francis of Assisi. This time is set aside by many churches in the autumn to give thanks for the natural world around us, to pray particularly for the protection of Creation and for the promotion of sustainable lifestyles which reverse our contribution to climate change.

Here in Tranent, we have set aside time for Creation Time for the last two years and are doing so again. We hold an All-Age Creation Time Service on Sunday 21st September and the day before that, on Saturday 20^{th,} we carry out a joint litter pick with the Tranent Wombles. This weekend is being followed up by three evenings of Bible study, specifically related to the Bible's guidance about our need to care for the world around us.

In practice, the work of Tranent Wombles in establishing pocket gardens and the Forest Garden in Tranent give us an example of how to do that. Although our summer congregational picnic to Vogrie Park was cancelled due to storm warnings, with thanks to the Wombles, we enjoyed a guided tour of the pocket gardens and to the Forest Park one Sunday in July. We found out about the best way to create a "dead hedge" which attracts birds, insects, hedgehogs and other creatures. We enjoyed walking through the bamboo tunnel and having a picnic on a beautifully hot summer's day.

This year of 2025, the theme for Creation Time is "Peace with Creation", This is linked to the need for justice to be restored, where there is none, in the world today. The premise is that there will be no peace without justice. What does this mean where we are, in our lives and for our community? This is something that we need to work out together, as we gather in Creation Time in worship, prayer and conversation.

We are not left alone to do that. We have the constant love and help of God, the Creator, Jesus our friend and companion and the Holy Spirit, who inspires us to keep on changing.

Tranent Parish Church Guild

Our opening meeting this year is on Tuesday, 14th of October at 1.30 in the church hall. Our Minister, Katherine, is our first speaker and she will also celebrate communion with us.



We are still in the process of compiling our syllabus and one of the speakers we have asked to come is from the Scottish Bible Society which the Guild nationally is supporting.

We look forward to hearing abut their work and I include information about their plans for the future.

Project details

Fewer than half of 0-2-year-olds are read to every day. We want to help change that. Reading to young children helps them feel safe and loved. It builds self-esteem, grows their vocabulary, and fires their imagination. Reading the Bible can help bring a family together and closer to God. Our vision is to offer every baby born in Scotland a free Share a Story toddler Bible on their first birthday. Every birthday after that, until age five, we will send a Bible related gift. On their fifth birthday each child will receive an early reader Bible to take them through their primary school years. The Bible gifts are wrapped by volunteers each month and an individual birthday card is written to every child. Before each package is posted we pray over them, knowing that God cares for these children and their families. This program costs just £50 per family for the five years and means that from a child's earliest memories and through their school years, the greatest stories from the Bible will play a part in shaping their lives. Our aim is to register up to 1000 babies per year, with the cumulative cost per year reaching £50k.

I would encourage anyone who would like to come to our meetings to do so. We would be so happy to see new faces. Once completed our syllabus will be on the church notice board and also on the Church's web site.

Along with others from our church I attend the Blindwells Cluster meetings. Excitingly, we ran our first holiday club in a while. The 2-day club ran on 4th & 5th August and had 9 children. Which is a great start.

Going forward there are a couple of things I'd appreciate prayer for. Recently, we were successful in a funding bid from Fa'side Area Partnership Health & Well Being Fund to run a community drop-in at Elphinstone. So, watch this space and pray that God blesses this initiative. Also, our second holiday club takes place on 20th October, please pray that our families will trust us with their children so we can share with them the love He has for us all.
